Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. Psalm 51:1




Just last week we kicked off the Lenten Season with ashes smudged on our foreheads. Sometimes, Ash Wednesday feels

like a scam to me. Throughout the year we study scripture, we follow Jesus, we think about what has to die within us so that we can have life. We are created in the image of God, living and breathing and trying our best to share God's love with one another. And today, we are told we will die, that our life is fragile and finite.

And all the other days the world tells us to take vitamins, to eat better, to exercise, to sleep more, to reduce stress in our lives so that we can live forever. We buy into the message that our best days are still ahead of us. We spend an incredible amount of time and money to prolong our lives- and last week we heard the words, "you are dust and to dust you will return."

But as the poet Jan Richardson tells us that we are created for Ash Wednesday, we are built for this, that we are to only turn our face towards the one who calls to us. This is good news, this should allow us to take a deep breath. This season we face and admit our own mortality,



that God is God and we are not. We do not have to attempt to manage our own brokenness, and now we are pushed to step into the deep and holy mystery of Christian life.

Let me suggest one of my favorite ways (I have shared this before) to practice the Lenten season. Simcha Bunim was a Jewish rabbi who lived in Poland in the 1700s. He is best known for what might be called the parable of the two pockets. The parable begins with two slips of paper. On one slip is written, "I am dust and ashes." On the other slip is written, "For my sake the world was created." These two slips of paper are meant to be carried around in two pockets.

Rabbi Bunim said, "Everyone must have two pockets, with a note in each pocket, so that he or she can reach into the one or the other, depending on the need. When feeling lowly and depressed, discouraged or disconsolate, one should reach into the right pocket, and, there, find the words: 'For my sake was the world created.' But when feeling high and mighty one should reach into the left pocket, and find the words: 'I am dust and ashes.'"

I challenge you this Lenten season to carry two notes, because we are both at once. For us to experience what God can do with dust, we must continue to stay the journey even when there seems to be no answers or conclusions to the question.

#### **Bread for the World News**



#### SPC PLAYGROUND ENHANCEMENT PROJECT

Calling all SPC Saints! Our church playground has fallen into disrepair and is in need of a little TLC and we need your help to get it back in good condition!

A group of volunteers has come together and devised a detailed plan for refurbishing the playground to make it a safe and inviting space, once again, for our preschool and church children to enjoy. The estimated cost of the playground renovation is \$2,400 - \$3,000. While the playground updates are definitely our first priority, there is also an extended vision for creating a covered picnic area in the unused field adjacent to the playground as a second phase of this project if extra funds become available. We think Spring is the perfect time to get started on this project and are excited to kick off this campaign.

A note from the Music Director

About the Music Through Lent

Lent: preparation through drawing deeper and closer to the Creator for the upcoming celebration of Easter

I remember observing Lent while growing up. In a very non-Presbyterian faith tradition, the time seemed to me to be focused on shame, guilt, restriction and hopelessness. It was not my favorite season. Seeing the expansiveness of God invited me into deeper, and yes, more risky paths of faith as I became an adult. The Creator is wildly beyond our comprehension and control.

How do we draw deeper and closer to such Divine wildness?

One way I've found helpful is to meditate on where I currently am in this moment. Not where I want to be or how I want the world to change or when I reach an arbitrary weight goal in the gym. We are not defined by labels, jobs, or our goals. Every small detail of our "now" is sacred - in the Beatitudes, Jesus blesses those in need, experiencing difficulty, serving others, doing the best they know to do, being persecuted for who they are. Not those who have it all together. Not those who have all the answers. But those in the wildernesses of life.

The Creator meets us where we are in our wilderness and blesses us. The music through Easter reflects this kaleidoscope of God meeting us in every moment. There are blessings, calls to serve, songs about how much God loves us, the comfort of Jesus as our Refuge. All of this to remind us <u>we never walk alone</u>.

What we seek in Lent to draw deeper and closer to has been present inside us all along.



Won't You Be My Neighbor Day is celebrated every year on March 20. The day honors, celebrates, and appreciates the late Fred Rogers, the immensely popular host of the preschool TV series "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood" which ran from 1968 to 2001. Although it has not aired for the past 22 years, many people still consider "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood" as the standard by which they measure all other kids' shows. The show is so



iconic that those who grew up in the '70s and '80s would surely have watched Mister Rogers head to the Neighborhood of Make-Believe and sing songs with his puppet friends.
